I am just experimenting






Biggest self-discovery: Going through the program made me realize how much I love doing branding & identity! I love the fact that you can build universes and make them real.


Coolest CCA experience:

During my first year, CCA participated in a charette that filled the nave with huge inflatable structures and included the whole architecture department.


